

Since 2005, more than 1000 workers have died in fires and building collapses while sewing clothing in Bangladesh for companies like Gap and Walmart.

Any day, there could be another deadly fire with workers locked inside once again.

Tommy Hilfiger has signed a binding fire safety agreement with unions and labor rights groups, and Gap should do the same.
